THETA FAMILIES ENJOY TRADITION OF BROTHERHOOD

ROBERT I. DOVE '28 MEMORIAL TESTAMENT TO STRENGTH OF THE BONDS OF BROTHERHOOD

In Theta chapter's history, there are many family names that have been prominent, with fathers, uncles, brothers all a part of the Theta chapter family — names such as Anderson, Clark, Doan, Long, Guy, Myers, Halliday, Wyant, Mauck, Littick, Van Buren, Kestle, Hammond, Vlerebome. None has been more prominent in terms of numbers as well as devotion to the spirit of Beta than the name Dove.

Robert I. Dove '28 was a devoted Beta for many years until his death in 1976. Robert, or R.I. as his classmates called him, and his wife Elizabeth Dove, had four sons, all of whom became OWU Theta Betas — Dave '53, Mike and Frank '58 and T. Clark '63. In memory of their father and husband, they have made a significant contribution to the current capital fund for "...needed house repairs to the chapter house at your committee's discretion." Along with their contribution, Dave '53 writes:

Theta chapter of Beta Theta Pi and OWU have long been a part of the Dove family traditions. Our grandfather, R.R. Dove, and his brother, T.C. Dove, were Betas, Class of 1902. My brothers and I are fifth-generation OWU graduates and Ashley Dove,

Announced in the latest issue of *The Beta Theta Pi Magazine* was the awarding of the 1995 Founders Fund Scholarship awards, including the Cleveland Alumni Scholarship award to Brian Hill '96. Each year, hundreds of Beta undergraduates apply for Founders Fund scholarships, which are made possible by alumni gifts to the Beta Leadership Fund. Initiated by the Trustees in 1949, the program honors and financially assists Betas and Beta sons and daughters who have excelled in academics, service and school involvement. The program has expanded dramatically and includes awards ranging from \$500 to \$1,500. It was further noted that \$87,000 in academic scholarships were awarded to 94 collegians in 1995.

Brian D. Hill '96 was cited for his service as chapter treasurer, alumni chair and pledge trainer. His significant academic achievements include five semesters on the dean's list, IFC award for academic excellence, and Pi Phi Honorary Society. In addition, Brian was recognized for service to the following organizations: founding member of Delta Pi Alpha German honor society, Habitat for Humanity, the American Heart Association and the American Diabetes Association. Brian is finishing his last semes-ter at OWU after studying in Heidelberg, Germany, last fall.

GREAT PLEDGE CLASS, HOUSE IMPROVEMENTS BODE WELL FOR THETA

The Theta chapter is able to approach the end of another academic year with a positive feeling about the past two semesters and anticipation for next fall. The young executive officers elected this past January include four sophomores and only one upperclassman. They have made quick and successful transitions to positions of serious responsibility in the chapter. While the fact that we have so many younger officers is undoubtedly due in part to the small number of seniors who will be in the house next year, the high number of underclassmen also reflects the enthusiasm of our younger brothers. Complementing that enthusiasm was the excellent

job that this year's departing seniors and involved alumni did in acclimating those who will return next year to the responsibilities and workings of the house. I have the utmost confidence that the Theta chapter will continue to improve in every area.

We pledged nine young men to the house this year, one in the fall and eight this spring. We had hoped to attain a slightly larger class in order to ensure financial stability for the chapter, but we could not be happier with the soon-to-be initiates that we pledged. Beta Theta Pi attracted young men from as far away as Arizona, Colorado and even Bolivia. Of the nine, eight are involved in five varsity sports. Most impressively,

the fall and spring pledge classes attained the highest grade-point averages of Ohio Wesleyan's 10 fraternities. All will make excellent additions to a chapter growing stronger in academics.

The chapter and house corporation have realized their goal of significantly improving the physical appearance of the house. The state of the house was a source of major concern for alumni when they returned to visit in past years and, consequently, were reluctant to make more visits or donations. We hope that our renewed determination to maintain the house and our coordination with the House Corporation will encourage more alumni to attend alumni events, spring and fall initiations and, if possible, to help the chapter to meet always increasing expenses. One major expense that must be met will be the complete replacement of plumbing for the bathrooms, and the resurfacing of the showers on both floors. The work is scheduled to be completed by the start of the next school year, and initial estimates indicate that the cost will be about \$80,000.

The entire chapter is looking forward to the reunion planned for next year; we hope to see Betas from all years return to Delaware and witness the progress of the Theta chapter firsthand.
